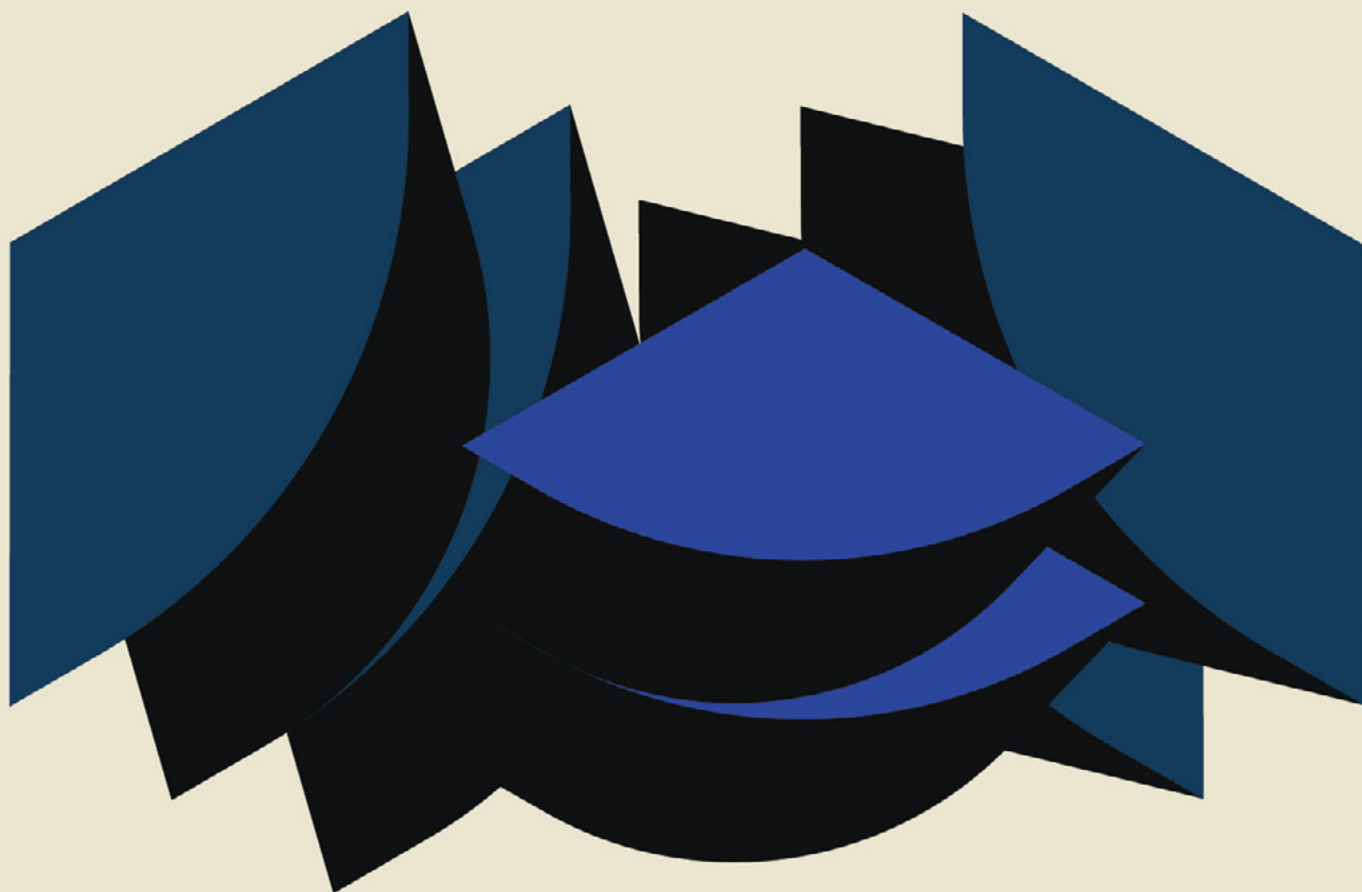

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UVODNA RIJEČ / FOREWORD

XV. TRIJENALE HRVATSKOGA KIPARSTVA

Trijenale hrvatskoga kiparstva pokrenula je davne 1982. Gliptoteka Hrvatske akademije znanosti i umjetnosti kako bi prezentirala suvremena kiparska ostvarenja prateći pritom heterogenost u stilske i tematske pristupu umjetnika svih generacija te likovnih rukopisa u različitim materijalima, medijima i tehnikama. Izlagani radovi tijekom proteklih četrnaest trijenala dali su nam pregled razvoja i promjena na području hrvatskoga kiparstva s nadom da smo na taj način potaknuli domaću kiparsku produkciju.

Protekle trijenalne izložbe imale su različite muzeološke pristupe i koncepte, usklađene s razvojem muzeoloških praksi u postavima, ali i dalekosežnije, uvođenjem nagrada za najbolje izložene radove te uključivanjem pratećih programa radi bolje interakcije s publikom kako bi se izložena djela približila publici, a aktualne teme akcentuirale. Uhodani koncept primijenjen je i na XV. izdanju *Trijenala*, pa se tako samostalnom izložbom predstavio Loren Živković Kuljiš, dobitnik Velike nagrade prethodnoga, *XIV. trijenala*. Kao bitna sastavnica u predstavljanju *Trijenala* i rada suvremenih umjetnika jest i dodjela nagrada. Naime, najbolje ocijenjeni izloženi radovi nagrađeni su jednom od sljedećih nagrada: Velikom nagradom *Trijenala* i trima jednakovrijednim nagradama koje dodjeljuje Gliptoteka, zatim Nagradom Hrvatske sekcije Međunarodnog udruženja likovnih kritičara – AICA-a, Nagradom Goranske kiparske radionice Lokve te posebnom Nagradom Ljevaonice Ujević. Uz predstavljanje radova uključene su i radionice za djecu i građanstvo te razgovori s umjetnicima.

TRIJENALE U OKOLNOSTIMA OBNOVE

I dok je *Trijenale hrvatskoga kiparstva* već tradicionalno prepoznatljiv projekt Gliptoteke, ovogodišnje XV. po redu izdanje napušta jedinstveni prostor matične mu Gliptoteke zbog obnove, stoga se izložba ove godine odvija u suradnji s Muzejom suvremene umjetnosti u Zagrebu. Time se izložbena aktivnost održava i u okolnostima izmještenosti, a u javnosti se evocira memorija na Gliptoteku, od upečatljivoga industrijskoga građevinskog korpusa istkanog opekrom do stalnog postava usmjerenog na skulpturu, a posebno na intenzivnu izložbenu aktivnost. Neželjenim prekidom izložbene djelatnosti te sada jedino mogućim radom u drugim muzejsko-galerijskim prostorima poput Muzeja suvremene umjetnosti, posudbama umjetnina za izložbene projekte drugih muzeja i galerija diljem Hrvatske te virtualnim izložbama nastojimo održati kontinuitet našeg rada, a posjetitelje podsjećati na vrijednost Gliptoteke u hrvatskome kulturnom prostoru.

Izbor radova *Trijenala* odgovorno i kritički provodi ocjenjivački sud sastavljen od uglednih umjetnika – kipara i povjesničara umjetnosti čiji se sastav bira uoči svakoga *Trijenala*. To je zalog za izbor ponajboljih predstavnika suvremene hrvatske kiparske scene.

THE 15th TRIENNIAL OF CROATIAN SCULPTURE

Back in 1982, the Glyptothèque of the Croatian Academy of Sciences and Arts launched the idea of sculpture triennials with the aim of presenting contemporary sculptural creations, respecting thereby heterogeneity in the style- and topic-related approaches of artists of all generations, and visual artworks created using various materials, media and techniques. The pieces of art exhibited in the previous fourteen Triennials have offered us a survey of the development and changes taken place in the field of the Croatian art of sculpture. We hope to have thereby stimulated the domestic sculptural production.

Previous triennial exhibitions chose various museological approaches and concepts, not only in harmony with the development of museological practices applied in the displays, but also more far-reaching – by introducing awards for the best artworks and by adding accompanying programmes with the aim of achieving better interaction with the audience in order to familiarize them with the pieces of art as much as possible, whilst accentuating the pressing topics. This run-in concept was used in the 15th Triennial in form of a solo show by Loren Živković Kuljiš, holder of the Grand Prix of the last Croatian Sculpture Triennial. One of the key components of our Triennials and contemporary oeuvres is awarding prizes. The exhibited artworks that were best rated were awarded one of the following: the Grand Prix of the Triennial and three ex aequo prizes awarded by the Glyptothèque; a Prize of the Croatian Section of AICA; the Prize of the Goran Sculpture Workshop of Lokve; and a special Ujević Foundry Prize. Accompanying activities included workshops for children and adults, as well as talks with the artists.

THE TRIENNIAL IN THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF RESTORATION

This year's 15th Croatian Sculpture Triennial – traditional and recognizable project of the Glyptothèque – has left its unique home venue due to restoration. Hence, this time, the exhibition has been organized together with the Museum of Contemporary Art in Zagreb. The exhibition-related activity is held in the circumstances of relocation, evoking thereby among the public memories of the Glyptothèque – from a signature industrial edifice built in bricks to a permanent sculptural display, and particularly memories of its intensive exhibition-related activity. Due to the unwelcome interruption of operation, we attempt to retain the continuity of our operation and keep reminding the audience of the importance of the Glyptothèque for the Croatian culture through operating in the only possible fashion – in other museums and galleries, such as the Museum of Contemporary Art; loans of artworks for projects conducted by other museums and galleries across Croatia; and virtual exhibitions.

Before every Triennial, a highly responsible and

Članovi ovogodišnjega ocjenjivačkog suda za odabir radova i nagrada *XV. trijenala hrvatskoga kiparstva* bili su akademik Zlatan Vrkljan, voditelj Gliptoteke HAZU, dr. sc. Martina Munivrana, muzejska savjetnica u Muzeju suvremene umjetnosti, doc. art. Nika Radić, akademska kiparica, red. prof. art. Loren Živković Kuljiš, akademski kipar, i Tihana Boban, viša kustosica u Gliptoteci HAZU.

Ocjenjivačkom sudu povjerena je zahtjevna uloga pregleda, sagledavanja i valorizacije više od 400 zaprimljenih radova od 243 autora. Odradio je „lavovski“ posao izabравši sedamdeset i tri umjetnička rada. Odgovornim izborom radova povjerenstvo je uspjele postići da izabrani umjetnici i njihova djela, međusobno različita na mnogo načina – instalacije, objekti u prostoru, multimedijjska djela (videouradci i projekcije), hologrami, grafike i fotografije korištene kao pomoćni medij za trodimenzionalni prikaz i brojem najskromniji dio, skulpture u klasičnom smislu – dostojno prezentiraju suvremeno hrvatsko kiparstvo.

I upravo različitost u izboru tema, osobito materijala, čiji izbor i primjena u oblikovnom i tehnološkom smislu nadilaze našu maštu i očekivanja, te novih i sve inovativnijih medija kao i usmjerenost na raznolike prostorne intervencije dovodi nas do propitkivanja odnosa prema tradicionalnomu kiparstvu i uvodi u svijet trodimenzionalne umjetnosti. Mišljenja smo da ova trijenalna izložba potvrđuje fluktuaciju umjetničkih praksi, a prisutnost međusobno generacijski udaljenih umjetnika, od posve mladih, dvadesetogodišnjaka koji tek traže svoje mjesto na domaćoj i inozemnoj kiparskoj sceni do afirmiranih kipara pruža mogućnost sagledavanja različitih pristupa i aspekata recentnoga kiparstva. Ako tomu pridodamo angažiranost i usmjerenost prema suvremenim društvenim i općeljudskim pitanjima i pokušaju propitkivanja i ukazivanja na njihovu pojavnost, tada zaključujemo da je to poslanje umjetnosti u suvremenom društvu.

Velik odaziv umjetnika na natječaj *XV. trijenala* daje nadu da je *Trijenale hrvatskoga kiparstva* prepoznato kao manifestacija vrijedna sudjelovanja, kao manifestacija koja osnažuje svijest o specifičnosti suvremenoga kiparskog stvaralaštva.

critical Prize Awarding Committee consisting of distinguished artists – sculptors and art historians – is elected and entrusted with the selection of artworks for the upcoming exhibition. Thereby, the selection of the finest representatives of the Croatian contemporary sculptural scene is ensured.

The members of the Prize Awarding Committee for the selection of artworks and the prizes at the 15th Croatian Sculpture Triennial were the following: Zlatan Vrkljan, F.C.A., head of the Glyptothèque of the Croatian Academy of Sciences and Arts; Dsc Martina Munivrana, museum advisor at the Museum of Contemporary Art; Nika Radić, academy-trained sculptor; Loren Živković Kuljiš, academy-trained sculptor; and Tihana Boban, senior curator at the Glyptothèque of the Croatian Academy of Sciences and Arts.

The Prize Awarding Committee encountered a highly demanding task of reviewing, analysing and valourising over 400 artworks created by 243 authors. The Committee selected seventy-three pieces of art, having thereby carried out a *lion's share* of the work. Deciding responsibly, it succeeded in achieving the set aim: for the selected artists and their artworks, diverse in many facets – installations, objects in space, multimedia pieces (videos and projections), holograms, prints and photographs used as an accessory medium for three-dimensional presentation, and sculpture in the classical sense (outnumbered by other pieces of art) – to offer a worthily presentation of the Croatian contemporary art of sculpture.

Diversity in the selection of topics, and in particular materials – the choice and application of which surpass in the formative and technological sense our imagination and our expectations, and of new and ever more innovative media, as well as orientation towards various spatial interventions has brought us to the point of questioning our relationship towards traditional sculpture and entering the world of three-dimensional art. We believe that this triennial exhibition confirms the fluctuation of art practices, while the presence of different generations of artists – from the youth in their twenties, who are still searching for their place on the national and international sculptural scene, to renowned sculptors – enables us to analyse various approaches to and aspects of the recent sculptural creation. Engagement in and orientation towards contemporary social and universal human questions, and the attempt to question and indicate to their presence leads us to the conclusion that this indeed is the true mission of art in the present-day society.

Considerable response of artists to the contest for the 15th Croatian Sculpture Triennial proved that this manifestation is worth participating in, being a forum for reinforcing the consciousness of the specific qualities of contemporary sculptural creation.

Izložba XV. trijenala hrvatskoga kiparstva, kao i proces žiriranja, nastavak je kontinuiranog djelovanja i organizacije ove iznimno značajne manifestacije koja se uvijek s nestrpljenjem iščekuje jer predstavlja najbolje od produkcije u zadanom mediju u protekle tri godine. Ovogodišnje izdanje obilježeno je cjelovitim procesom izmještenosti izložbe, nastavljajući kontinuitet u predstavljanju umjetničkih praksi koje se odmiču od tradicionalnih formi skulpture prema interdisciplinarnim i hibridnim medijskim istraživanjima. To ne upućuje na gubitak identiteta medija, već na njegovo proširenje u kojem se skulptura redefinira interdisciplinarnim i kontekstualnim pristupima. Hibridnost se ne očituje samo na razini medija, već i u tematskim i konceptualnim pristupima umjetnica i umjetnika, koji se kreću između osobnih i kolektivnih iskustava, lokalnih i globalnih konteksta, povijesnih referenci i suvremenih društvenih pitanja.

Promjena mjesta održavanja ponajviše je obilježilo XV. trijenale hrvatskoga kiparstva. Izložba je prvi put u cijelosti izmještena iz prostora za koji je inicijalno bila koncipirana za drukčiju prostornu situaciju, u izlagački prostor Muzeja suvremene umjetnosti. Privremeno cjelovito izmještanje iz prostora koji skulpturu veže za njezin povijesni kontekst i materijalnost u drugi izlagački prostor, prostor Muzeja suvremene umjetnosti – „živo mjesto stvaranja, izlaganja, interpretiranja i čuvanja suvremene umjetnosti u svim njezinim pojavnostima“, koji svojim programima podržava interdisciplinarnost i medijsku fluidnost, sa sobom nosi i određenu simboliku. Izmještanje, odnosno prijenos iz ustaljenog trajnog

The exhibition of the 15th Triennial of Croatian Sculpture, as well as the process of judging, is a follow-up to continuous activity and organisation of this extremely significant event which is always eagerly expected since it presents the best productions in the specified medium in the past three years. This year's edition has been marked by the integral process of the exhibition's displacement, maintaining the continuity in presenting artistic practices that move away from the traditional forms of sculpture towards interdisciplinary and hybrid media research. This does not indicate a loss of the medium's identity, but rather its expansion in which the sculpture is redefined with interdisciplinary and contextual approaches. The hybridity is manifested not only at the level of the medium, but also in the artists' thematic and conceptual approaches, which move between personal and collective experiences, local and global contexts, historical references, and contemporary social issues.

The change in the venue marked the 15th Triennial of Croatian Sculpture the most. For the first time, the exhibition has been completely displaced from the space for which it was initially conceived and into a different spatial situation, the exhibition space of the Museum of Contemporary Art. The temporary complete displacement from the space binding the sculpture to its historic context and materiality into another exhibition space, that of the Museum of Contemporary Art – “a lively place of creation, exhibition, interpretation and preservation of contemporary art in all of its forms,”



okvira u novi prostorni i kontekstualni okvir, omogućilo je i veći broj radova na jednom mjestu, što je pridonijelo cjelovitosti te istodobno otvorilo mogućnost nove percepcije izloženih radova u odnosu na novi prostorni kontekst. Arhitektura novog izlagačkog prostora pritom uspostavlja nove odnose između radova i prostora i njegova značenja, oblikujući i omogućujući drukčiju percepciju izložbe, koja je u prijašnjim izdanjima tražila aktivniju participaciju publike zbog izmještenosti izložbe na više lokacija.

I ovo Trijenale, kao i prethodna, upućuju na promjenu u pristupu mediju skulpture, koja se u suvremenoj praksi pokazuje podložnom transformacijama i preplitanjima s drugim medijima. Takva hibridnost nije novost u teoriji suvremene umjetnosti: već 1979. povjesničarka umjetnosti Rosalind Krauss u eseju *Sculpture in the Expanded Field* redefinira skulpturu kao otvoreno polje prostornih odnosa, oslobađajući je fiksnog medija i stabilnog mjesta. Trijenale hrvatskoga kiparstva od svojeg osnutka 1982. slijedi taj koncept te omogućuje predstavljanje radova umjetnika i njihova „snalaženja“ u mediju koji, prema Krauss, postaje „pozicija u logičkom polju, a ne privilegirani centralni objekt“. Svojevrsni sinkronicitet u smislu promjene paradigme medija skulpture i osnivanja Trijenala dovodi do zaključka o relevantnosti izložbe kao njezina pokazatelja stanja suvremene umjetničke scene u tom mediju.

Ovogodišnje izdanje Trijenala hrvatskog kiparstva zadržava navedeni kontinuitet te pokazuje kako skulptura i dalje funkcionira kao otvoreno, fleksibilno polje eksperimenta. Izabrani radovi ovogodišnje izložbe nanovo svjedoče o raznolikim pristupima, spajajući tradicionalne kiparske materijale s novim tehnologijama i interdisciplinarnim strategijama. Ujedno ističe spremnost autora da zakorače u nova polja djelovanja eksperimentirajući s tehnologijama i materijalima, u procese u kojima djelovanje nije samo dvostrani odnos umjetnika i materijala, već uključuje i druge suradnike u procesu produkcije, čime se otvara polje neizvjesnosti u pogledu stabilnosti i postojanosti prirode rada.

O velikom interesu umjetnika svjedoče mnogobrojne prijave, što je ovogodišnjem ocjenjivačkom žiriju bio veliki izazov u odabiru radova. Žiri je, u procesu selekcije, balansirao između inovativnih pristupa, kvalitete izvedbe i reprezentativnosti različitih medija, materijala i konceptualnih strategija, osiguravajući da izložba reflektira kako tradiciju, tako i aktualne tendencije u hrvatskom kiparstvu. Od 247 prijavljenih autora, odabrano je 73 rada koja najbolje predstavljaju produkciju posljednje tri godine, a prostornim i kustoskim postavom izložba je omogućila sagledavanje suvremene umjetničke produkcije kao „proširenog polja“, u kojem radovi, prostor i institucionalni okviri djeluju kao međusobno povezani elementi. Odabrani radovi u svojoj raznolikosti pokazuju vitalnost i pluralnost suvremene umjetničke produkcije, različite generacije autorica i autora te širok spektar pristupa i strategija koje oblikuju današnju umjetničku scenu.

which supports with its programmes interdisciplinarity and media fluidity, also implies a certain kind of symbolism. The displacement, i.e., the transfer from an established permanent framework into a new and contextual one, also enabled a larger number of works at one place, which contributed to the integrity and simultaneously opened up the possibility of new perception of the exhibited works in relation to the new spatial context. The architecture of the new exhibition space thereby establishes new relations between the works, the space and the latter's meaning, forming and enabling a different perception of the exhibition that sought in its previous editions a more active audience participation due to the exhibition's dislocation at multiple locations.

Just like the previous ones, this Triennial also indicates a change in the approach to the medium of sculpture, which is manifested in contemporary practice as being subject to transformation and intertwining with other media. Such hybridity is nothing new in contemporary art theory: as early as 1979, in the essay *Sculpture in the Expanded Field*, art historian Rosalind Krauss redefined sculpture as an open field of spatial relations, releasing it from a fixed medium and a stable place. Since its founding in 1982, the Triennial of Croatian Sculpture has been following this concept, enabling the presentation of the artists' works and their "coping" in the medium which, according to Krauss, becomes a position in the logical field, and not a privileged central object. A kind of synchronicity, in the sense of the change in paradigm of the medium of sculpture and the founding of the Triennial, leads to the conclusion on the exhibition's relevance as its indicator of the state of the contemporary art scene in this medium.

This year's edition of the Triennial of Croatian Sculpture retains the aforementioned continuity and shows that sculpture still functions as an open, flexible field of experiment. The selected works of this year's exhibition testify anew of the diverse approaches, merging traditional sculptural materials with new technologies and interdisciplinary strategies. This also accentuates the authors' willingness to step into new fields of action by experimenting with technologies and materials, into processes in which action is not merely a two-sided relationship between the author and the material, but also includes other collaborators in the process of production, which opens up a field of uncertainty as regards stability and consistency of the work's nature.

Numerous applications testify of the great interest of artists, which presented a major challenge to this year's jury in selecting the works. In the selection process, the jury balanced between innovative approaches, the quality of execution, and the representativity of different media, materials and conceptual strategies, ensuring that the exhibition reflects both the tradition and the topical tendencies in Croatian sculpture. Out of 247 submitted works, 73 of them were selected as best representing the production in the last three years; with its spatial and curatorial design, the



Izbor tema ovogodišnjeg Trijenala ponovno je raznolik, pa je teško izdvojiti dominantne teme ili smjere koji bi radove mogli smjestiti u homogen i jasno definiran tematski okvir. Upravo ta izražena heterogenost formalnih pristupa jedno je od najvažnijih obilježja ovoga izdanja, ukazujući na konvergenciju oko nekoliko ključnih područja suvremene prakse. U nastavku teksta naznačuju se teme koje su pri žiriranju, tijekom analize radova, „iskočile“ još u početnoj fazi rada na izložbi. Stoga ovaj tekst ne pretendira na analizu svih izloženih radova, već nastoji mapirati ključne tematske i formalne tendencije na odabranim primjerima koji ih artikuliraju i objašnjavaju.

U pojedinim radovima snažno je obilježena tema tijela, ali ne u klasičnoj formi, već se tijelo tretira kao prostor napetosti, memorije, ranjivosti i kritike. Ono se pojavljuje fragmentirano kao trag, otisak, membrana, posredno prisutno u pojedinim elementima koji upućuju na odsutnost tjelesne prisutnosti, odnosno kao simbolički nositelj unutarnjih stanja. Radovi često tretiraju tijelo kao mjesto zadržane reakcije, a ne ekspresije, tijelo koje pamti, koje je oblikovano vanjskim pritiscima, tijelo koje reagira. Skulptura se pritom udaljava od reprezentacije i postaje plod fizičkog ili emocionalnog procesa. Antonija Balić, Matija Čop, Petra Dinjaški Petrović koriste se različitim materijalima kao metaforom tijela koje upija, briše i iscjeljuje, koje tretira emociju i traumu kao fizičko taloženje koje može biti ritualno otpušteno, kao metaforu upisa emocionalnih zapisa. Ivan Fijolić autoironično tematizira vlastito tijelo u odnosu na moć,

exhibition enabled the perception of contemporary artistic production as an "expanded field" in which the works, the space and the institutional frameworks operate as mutually connected elements. The selected works show in their diversity the vitality and plurality of contemporary artistic production, the different generations of artists, and the wide spectrum of approaches and strategies that shape the present-day art scene.

The selection of topics of this year's Triennial is also diverse; therefore, it is difficult to single out the dominant topics or currents that could position the works into a homogenous or clearly defined thematic framework. It is exactly this pronounced heterogeneity of formal approaches that is one of the most important features of this edition, indicating the convergence around several key areas of artistic practice. The text below lists the topics which "turned up" at judging, during the analysis of the works, as early as during the initial phase of work on the exhibition. Therefore, this text does not aspire to analyse all works exhibited, but rather seeks to map key thematic and formal tendencies on select examples that articulate and elaborate them.

Certain works are strongly marked by the subject of the body, albeit not in its classic form; rather, the body is treated as the space of tension, memory, vulnerability, and critique. It appears fragmentarily as a trace, an imprint, a membrane, as indirectly present in certain elements indicating the absence of corporeal presence, i.e., as a symbolic bearer of internal states. The works often treat the body as the site of reserved

pogled i kontrolu te ga istovremeno izlaže i relativizira. Karlo Klen predstavlja hiperealistično tijelo, precizna realistična obrada ne služi iluziji, već pojačavanju osjećaja prisutnosti i identifikacije, pri čemu tijelo postaje simbol kolektivnog iskustva i egzistencijalne neizvjesnosti.

Značajan broj radova predstavljenih na ovogodišnjem Trijenalu ne usmjerava se na stvaranje dovršenih, zatvorenih objekata, već naglasak stavlja na sam proces, promjenjivost kroz vrijeme i stanje „između“. Takav pristup unosi u fokus temu procesualnosti putem koje su transformacija i nestabilnost forme ključni elementi suvremenog kiparskog izraza. U mnogim radovima forma postoji u napetom odnosu materijala i sile koja na njega djeluje, stvarajući osjećaj nestabilnosti i neizvjesnosti. Ta dinamika ne odražava samo materijalnu dimenziju, već i aktualni društveni trenutak obilježen krizom i nesigurnošću. Medij skulpture time postaje medij kojim se reflektira suvremeni osjećaj promjenjivosti, prilagodbe i stalne transformacije, dok istovremeno otvara prostor za promišljanje o prirodi umjetničkog djela kao neprestanom procesu, a ne fiksnoj točki u vremenu. U radu Vladimira Novaka proces postaje srž skulpture: forma se neprestano mijenja kroz odnos svjetlosti, vode i prostora, čime se percepcija svakodnevnih, gotovo nevidljivih pojava stavlja u središte umjetničkog iskustva, čime se umjetnički rad ostvaruje kao vremenski uvjetovan događaj, a ne kao stabilan, monumentalan objekt. Pojedini umjetnici snažno naglašavaju procesualnost i istraživanje materijalnosti kao ključne odrednice suvremenog kiparskog izraza. Među njima,

reaction instead of expression, as the body which remembers, which is formed by external pressures, as the body which reacts. The sculpture thereby moves away from representation and becomes the fruit of the physical or emotional process. Antonija Balić, Matija Čop, Petra Dinjaški Petrović use different materials as the metaphor for the body which absorbs, erases and heals, which treats emotions and trauma as physical sedimentation that can be released ritually, as a metaphor for inscribing emotional records. Ivan Fijolić self-ironically thematises his own body in relation to power, view and control, exhibiting it and relativising it at the same time. Karlo Klen presents a hyper-realistic body; the precise realist processing does not serve an illusion, but rather the intensifying of the feeling of presence and identification, whereby the body becomes the symbol of collective experience and existential uncertainty.

A significant number of works presented at this year's Triennial are not directed at creating complete, enclosed objects, but rather puts an emphasis on the process itself, the variability over time and the state "between." Such approach brings into focus the topic of processuality, through which the transformation and instability of form are the key elements of contemporary sculptural expression. In many works, the form exists in a tense relationship between the material and the force acting thereupon, creating a sense of instability and uncertainty. Such dynamics reflects not only the material dimension, but also the topical social moment marked by crisis and uncertainty. The medium of sculp-





Miran Blažek pristupa skulpturi kao rezultatu procesa, u kojem djelo nastaje dinamičnim razvojem, a konačan oblik proizlazi iz niza transformacija i odluka tijekom stvaranja. Alem Korkut usmjerava svoju pažnju na ispitivanje svojstava materijala, pri čemu se u njegovim radovima osjeća atmosfera propadanja – materijal postaje nositelj vremena i promjene, evocira osjećaj prolaznosti i dekadencije. Marija Josipović bavi se procesualnim izmještanjem medija skulpture, razmatrajući granice i mogućnosti medija eksperimentiranjem s njegovom pozicijom i funkcijom. S druge strane, Luka Kirin otvara prostor neuspjeha kao strukturu, pri čemu neuspjeh nije shvaćen kao kraj ili poraz, već kao konstruktivan element koji oblikuje strukturu djela.

Dio radova usmjeren je na kritičko propitivanje koje se usmjerava na političke, ideološke i socijalne sustave te na sustave vrijednosti koji oblikuju suvremeno društvo. Istraživanjem navedenih tema skulptura postaje sredstvo za razotkrivanje i problematiziranje sustava moći, političkih i ideoloških sustava, birokracije, tržišnih mehanizama, automatizacije te institucionalnih okvira koji određuju logiku učinkovitosti. U tom kontekstu, umjetnička djela često preuzimaju različite jezike svakodnevice ne bi li ironijom i subverzijom taj jezik preobrazili, funkcionalno pretvaraju u besmisleno, a ozbiljno u apsurdno. Takvim pristupom, osim što reflektiraju izazove današnjeg društva, radovi aktivno sudjeluju u njihovu razotkrivanju, otvarajući prostor za promišljanje o ulozi umjetnosti u kontekstu sveprisutne instrumentalizacije i standardizacije procesa i vrijednosti.

Kritičko propitivanje političkih i ideoloških sustava produbljuje se u prostornoj instalaciji Ane Mušćet, koja rat promišlja ne kao iznimno stanje, već kao ritualizirani i ponavljajući model nasilja ugrađen u strukture prostora i društvenih odnosa, propitujući spektakl konflikta i mogućnost susreta izvan ustaljenih obrazaca nasilja.

Matija Plavčić i Viktor Popović u svojim radovima kritički propituju sustave i način na koji oblikuju percepciju i vrijednost u društvu, koristeći se različitim medijima za aktivno uključivanje promatrača u proces refleksije. Radovi Dine Bičanića i Jelene Bogdanić primjerice propituju svakodnevne sustave vrijednosti, rada i tehnologije, uključujući promatrača u kritičku refleksiju o novcu i konzumerizmu. Daniel Kovač konceptom dezertstva kao metaforom ukazuje na povlačenja pojedinca iz sustava besmislenih zadataka i zloupotrebe ideala, istražujući napetost između težnje za autentičnom slobodom i kapitaliziranog otpora u suvremenom društvu. Lucija Marin pak se koristi administrativnim dokumentom potrošačkog sustava kao *ready-made*, čime osobni arhiv postaje sredstvo kritike ekonomije potrošnje, optimizacije i digitalne racionalizacije pamćenja. Neonska skulptura Renate Poljak frazom „Ljubav je politika. Politika je ljubav.“ propituje moć, odgovornost i solidarnost u suvremenom društvu, pozivajući na aktivnu brigu i kritički odnos prema političkim i društvenim strukturama. Kristian Kožul putem povijesnog narativa Seljačke bune propituje društvene i političke mehanizme, koristi se

skulpture thereby becomes the medium used to reflect the contemporary sense of variability, adjustment and constant transformation, while simultaneously opening up the space for deliberating on the nature of an artwork as an ongoing process instead of a fixed point in time. In the work by Vladimir Novak, the process becomes the sculpture's essence: the form changes continuously through the relationship between light, water and space, whereby the perception of everyday, nearly invisible phenomena is placed in the centre of the artistic experience, with which the artwork is actualised as a temporally conditioned event instead of a stable, monumental object. Some of the artists strongly emphasise the processuality and the study of materiality as the key determinants of contemporary artistic expression. One of them, Miran Blažek, approaches sculpture as the result of the process, in which the work is created in a dynamic development, while its final form arises from a series of transformations and decisions during the creation. Alem Korkut directs his attention to examining the properties of the material, whereby his works emanate an atmosphere of deterioration – the material becomes the bearer of time and change, it evokes the sense of transience and decadence. Marija Josipović engages in the processual dislocation of the medium of sculpture, reflecting on the limitations and possibilities of the medium by experimenting with its position and function. On the other hand, Luka Kirin opens up the space of failure as a structure, whereby failure is not perceived as an end or defeat, but rather as a constructive element forming the structure of the work.

A portion of the works is aimed at critical challenging directed at political, ideological and social systems, as well as the systems of values forming the contemporary society. By exploring the aforementioned topics, sculpture becomes a means for exposing and problematising the systems of power, the political and ideological systems, the bureaucracy, the market mechanisms, the automatization, and the institutional frameworks that determine the logic of efficiency. In this context, the artworks often overtake different idioms of everyday life so as to transform this idiom with irony and subversion, changing the functional into the pointless and the serious into the absurd. With such approach—apart from reflecting the challenges of today's society—the works actively participate in their exposure, opening up space for deliberating on the role of art in the context of the omnipresent instrumentalization and standardization of processes and values.

The critical challenging of political and ideological systems is deepened in the spatial installation by Ana Mušćet, who deliberates on war not as an exceptional situation, but rather as a ritualised and repeating model of violence built into the structures of space and social relations, questioning the spectacle of conflict and the possibility of meeting beyond the preestablished patterns of violence.

In their works, Matija Plavčić and Viktor Popović critically





groteskom i karikaturalnim pretjerivanjem te komentira suvremene društvene i ideološke fenomene.

Zanimljivost ovogodišnjeg Trijenala također su radovi koji se referiraju na svakodnevicu, humor, igru i koji aktivno uključuju gledatelje njihovom participacijom. Publika nije samo promatrač, već aktivni sudionik u potpunoj realizaciji rada kretanjem, dodiranjem ili zvukom. Time skulptura kao medij poprima višeznačnost u smislu probijanja prostora skulpture u događaj. Radovi Željka Beljana, Alexa Brajkovića, Đanina Božića, Natalije Škalić, Vitar Drinkovića i Luke Kirina naglašavaju participaciju publike i interaktivnost, pri čemu posjetitelji aktivno oblikuju iskustvo kroz igru, kretanje i prisutnost, pretvarajući izložbeni prostor u dinamičan, taktilan i reagirajući sustav. Interaktivna instalacija Igora Rufa pak rekonstrukcijom fotelje i pokretnim elementima stvara duhovit i participativan ambijent koji propituje uloge objekata i publike u svakodnevnom iskustvu. Ironija svakodnevice prisutna je u radu Ivana Tudeka.

Jedna od trenutačno aktualnijih tema je ekološka svijest i odnos čovjeka prema okolišu. U radovima pojedinih autora ekološke teme pojavljuju se konzistentno, ali suptilno uporabom različitih materijala, bioloških procesa i međusobnih odnosa čovjeka i okoliša. Radovi ne nude samo deklarativnu kritiku ekoloških problema, već gledatelju omogućuju iskustveno učenje i osvježavanje vlastita utjecaja na prostor i sustav. Ines Krsić u svojem radu dokolicu ne prikazuje kao neutralno stanje odmora, već kao prostor napetosti između slobode, kontrole i iscrpljivanja resursa. Motivima prividnog odmora i

examine the systems and the manner in which they form perception and value in society, using different media for the observers' active inclusion into the process of reflection. For example, the works by Dino Bičanić and Jelena Bogdanić challenge the everyday systems of value, work and technology, and include the observer into a critical reflection on money and consumerism. With the concept of desertion as a metaphor, Daniel Kovač indicates the individual's withdrawal from the system of pointless tasks and abuse of ideals, examining the tension between the strive for authentic freedom and the capitalised resistance in contemporary society. On the other hand, Lucija Marin uses the administrative document of the consumer society as a ready-made, whereby the personal archive becomes a means for criticising the economy of consumption, optimisation, and digital rationalisation of memory. With the phrase "Love Is Politics, Politics Is Love," the neon sculpture by Renata Poljak challenges power, responsibility and solidarity in contemporary society, calling for active care and critical attitude towards the political and social structures. Through the historic narrative of the Croatian-Slovene Peasant Revolt, Kristian Kožul examines the social and political mechanisms, uses grotesque and caricatural hyperbole, and comments on the contemporary social and ideological phenomena.

An interesting feature of this year's Triennial are also works referring to everyday life, humour, play, and which actively include the viewers with their participation. The audience are not merely observers, but

distopijskih pejzaža, njezin rad povezuje ekološku krizu s društvenim imperativima produktivnosti i potrošnje, naglašavajući gubitak ravnoteže između čovjeka, okoliša i suvremenog načina života. Slično tome, i rad Vojina Hraste istražuje granice ljudske kontrole nad prirodnim procesima, ali kroz prizmu energetske sustava. Zatvorenim energetske sustavom autor metaforički prikazuje ovisnost suvremenog društva o izvorima energije koje ne može nadzirati. Kretanje bez mogućnosti izbora ili promjene smjera upućuje na zapletenost unutar neodrživih ekoloških i tehnoloških sustava, energija istovremeno omogućuje i ograničava ljudsko djelovanje. Siniša Lordan u svojem radu kroz zatvoreni i kontrolirani sustav miješanja materije ukazuje na nepredvidivost ekoloških procesa i osjetljivu ravnotežu između ljudske intervencije i prirodne dinamike.

S druge strane, radovi Nine Kurtele i Marine Rajšić povezuje promišljanje prostora kao nositelja memorije, pri čemu se rekonstrukcijom intimnog atelijera (Kurtela) i prizivanjem povijesno obilježenog mjesta (Rajšić) otvara odnos između osobnog i kolektivnog sjećanja, prisutnosti i odsutnosti te mogućnosti obnove kroz umjetnički čin. Ujedno u radu Marine Rajšić suptilno se upućuje na zaboravljeni povijesni i kulturni kontekst mjesta Lipa, gdje se zajednica uspjela ponovno izgraditi unatoč devastaciji. Njezino djelo postaje meditacija o trajanju, obnovi i snazi zajednice u prirodi i društvu.

Snažan intimizam vidljiv je u djelima koja malim formatima, nježnim materijalima i suptilnim teksturama naglašavaju introspektivnu dimenziju skulpture. Ana Kovačić, Paulina Jazvić, Marijana Stanić, Tiana Pozaić i Tea Teodorović kreiraju intimne prostorne susrete između djela i promatrača, otvarajući osobne narative i emotivne slojeve. S druge strane, suvremena organska skulptura ističe se tematskim fokusom na prirodu, biološke forme i cikluse života, pri čemu umjetnici istražuju kako materijali i forme mogu odražavati „život“ i dinamiku prirodnog svijeta. Posebno se ističu radovi Manuele Pauk i Petra Popijača, koji kombiniraju različite materijale radi stvaranja izražajnih, gotovo pulsirajućih estetika. Njihove skulpture nisu zatvorene ni statične, već prate logiku rasta, transformacije i cikličkoga gibanja, čime otvaraju pitanja o međuprostoru između prirodnog i umjetnog. U tom kontekstu, reljef od pečene gline Petra Popijača posebno zaokuplja pažnju svojom sposobnošću da reproducira tragove trave, kao i otiske prolaska ljudi ili strojeva. Takav umjetnički postupak simbolizira prolaznost i stalnu promjenjivost ekološkog okruženja. Materijalnim i formalnim odabirima djelo ukazuje na potrebu za uravnoteženim odnosom između ljudske aktivnosti i prirodne ravnoteže, potičući promatrača na razmišljanje o odgovornosti prema okolišu i održivosti svakodnevnih praksi.

Tematske cjeline ovogodišnjeg Trijenala obuhvaćaju i reference na muzejske institucije, u kojima kiparstvo zauzima refleksivan stav prema galerijskim prostorima te preispituje vlastiti položaj unutar šireg kulturnog okvira. U takvom pristupu, umjetnici kritički

also active participators in the complete actualisation of the work with movement, touch, or sound. The sculpture as the medium thereby assumes ambiguity in the sense of the space of the sculpture penetrating into the event. The works by Željko Beljan, Alex Brajković, Đanina Božić, Natalija Škalić, Vitar Drinković and Luka Kirin highlight the participation of the audience and the interactivity, whereby the visitors actively form the experience through play, movement and presence, turning the exhibition space into a dynamic, tactile and reacting system. On the other hand, the interactive installation by Igor Ruf creates a humorous and participative ambience with the reconstruction of an armchair and the moving elements, challenging the roles of objects and the audience in everyday experience. The irony of everyday life is present in the work by Ivan Tudek.

One of the currently more relevant topics is the environmental awareness and the attitude of man towards the environment. In works by particular authors, the environmental topics appear consistently, albeit subtly with the use of different materials, biological processes and interrelations between man and the environment. The works not only offer a declarative critique of environmental issues, but also enable the observer's experiential learning and awareness of own influence on the space and the system. In her work, Ines Krsić does not show leisure as a neutral state of resting, but rather as the space of tension between freedom, control, and depletion of resources. With the motifs of seeming respite and dystopian landscapes, her work





promišljaju instituciju kao mjesto koje oblikuje percepciju i tumačenje umjetničkog djela.

Jednako važna je i uspostava dijaloga s povijesnim ili poznatim autorima. Taj dijalog često poprima oblik hommagea, reinterpretacije ili ironičnog komentara, čime suvremeni umjetnici mapiraju vlastiti odnos prema tradiciji i kanonima povijesti umjetnosti. Takav pristup omogućuje propitivanje autoriteta, otvara prostor za kritičku distancu, ali i za kreativno nadovezivanje na nasljeđe prošlih generacija.

Umjetnici poput Predraga Pavića, Viktora Popovića, Igora Rufa i Tanje Vujašinić posebno se ističu u propitivanju institucionalnog i kulturnog konteksta. Njihov rad pozicionira skulpturu kao aktivnog sudionika u povijesnom i suvremenom diskursu, stvarajući situacije u kojima djelo izlazi iz okvira pasivne izloženosti i postaje pokretač novih značenja i interpretacija.

Zaključno, Trijenale tako ostaje najvjerniji kroničar transformacije medija, potvrđujući da je put od 1982. do 2025. godine bio put sagledavanja i praćenja od čvrstog objekta k hibridnom iskustvu koje i dalje ostaje nepredvidiv u svojim transformacijama u odnosu na medij. Analiza trogodišnje aktivnosti umjetničke hrvatske scene mapira stanje suvremenog hrvatskog kiparstva koje se odvija između materije i nematerijalnog objekta i procesa, osobnog iskustva i društvene analize. Podzastupljenost klasičnih kiparskih paradigmi već dulje vrijeme upućuje na to da je dodatno naglašen pomak prema skulpturi kao otvorenom sustavu, koji aktivno sudjeluje u problematiziranju određenih tema. Može se zaključiti da medij skulpture ostaje u sigurnim rukama hrvatske umjetničke scene čije nove produkcije s nestrpljenjem očekujemo u sljedeće tri godine – do novog izdanja Trijenala.

connects the environmental crisis with the social imperatives of productivity and consumption, highlighting the loss of balance between man, the environment, and the contemporary way of life. Similarly, the work by Vojin Hraste explores the limitations of human control over natural processes, albeit through the prism of energetic systems. With an enclosed energetic system, the author metaphorically illustrates the dependence of the contemporary society on energy sources that cannot be controlled. The movement without the possibility of choice or a change in direction indicates the complexity within unsustainable environmental and technological systems; the energy simultaneously enables and limits human action. In his work, Siniša Lordan indicates—through an enclosed and controlled system of mixing of matter—the unpredictability of environmental processes and the delicate balance between human intervention and natural dynamics.

On the other hand, the works by Nina Kurtela and Marina Rajšić are connected by deliberating on the space as the bearer of memory, whereby the reconstruction of an intimate studio (Kurtela) and evoking the historically marked place (Rajšić) opens up a relationship between personal and collective memory, presence and absence, and the possibility of restoration through an artistic act. The work by Marina Rajšić also features a subtle reference to the forgotten historical and cultural context of the settlement of Lipa, where the community was able to be rebuilt in spite of devastation. Her work becomes a meditation on the community's duration, restoration and strength in nature and society.

Strong intimism is visible in the works which highlight the sculpture's introspective dimension with small-scale formats, delicate materials, and subtle gestures. Ana Kovačić, Paulina Jazvić, Marijana Stanić, Tiana Pozaić and Tea Teodorović create intimate spatial encounters between the works and the observers, opening up personal narratives and emotional strata. On the other hand, contemporary organic sculpture stands out with the thematic focus on nature, biological forms and cycles of life, whereby the artists explore how the materials and the forms can reflect the "liveliness" and dynamics of the natural world. The works by Manuela Pauk and Petar Popijač particularly stand out, which combine different materials so as to create expressive, nearly pulsating aesthetics. Their sculptures are neither enclosed nor static, but rather follow the logic of growth, transformation and cyclic motion, whereby they open up questions on the interspace between the natural and the artificial. In this context, the baked-clay relief by Petar Popijač especially grabs attention with its ability to reproduce traces of grass, as well as the imprints of humans or machines passing by. Such artistic approach symbolises transience and constant variability of the ecological environment. With its material and formal selections, the work indicates the need for a balanced relationship between human activity and nat-

ural balance, provoking the observer to think of the responsibility towards the environment and sustainability of everyday practices.

The thematic units of this year's Triennial also encompass references to museum institutions, in which sculpture takes a reflective stand towards gallery spaces and reexamines its own position within the broader cultural framework. In this approach, the artists critically deliberate on the institution as the place that forms perception and interpretation of an artwork.

The establishment of dialogue with historic or known authors is equally important. Such dialogue often assumes the form of an homage, reinterpretation or an ironic commentary, with which contemporary artists map their own attitude towards traditions and canons of art history. Such approach enables the challenging of authority, opens up space for critical distance, but also for creative building on the legacy of previous generations.

Artists such as Predrag Pavić, Viktor Popović, Igor Ruf and Tanja Vujašinić are especially prominent in challenging the institutional and cultural context. Their work positions sculpture as an active participant in the historical and contemporary discourse, creating situations in which a work leaves the framework of passive exposure and becomes an initiator of new meanings and interpretations.

In conclusion, the Triennial therefore becomes the most trusted critic of the medium's transformation, confirming that the path from 1982 to 2025 was the one

of perceiving and following from a solid object towards a hybrid experience that still remains unpredictable in its transformations in relation to the medium. The analysis of the three-year activity of the Croatian art scene maps the state of contemporary Croatian sculpture that proceeds between the matter and the immaterial object and process, personal experience and social analysis. The underrepresentation of classic sculptural paradigms, which has been the case for a while, indicates that the shift towards the sculpture as an open system—which actively participates in problematising certain topics—is additionally emphasised. We could conclude that the medium of sculpture remains in safe hands of the Croatian art scene, whose new productions we eagerly await in the next three years – until the Triennial's next edition.

AN EXPLANATION OF THE AWARDS BY THE PANEL OF JUDGES

VELIKA NAGRADA XV. TRIJENALA HRVATSKOGA KIPARSTVA Kristian Kožul

Kristian Kožul u radu *Barjaci* (1573.) dekonstruira povijesni narativ i mit o Hrvatsko-slovenskoj seljačkoj buni primjenom raznovrsnih umjetničkih postupaka radi propitivanja instrumenata vladajućih struktura i načina njihove prezentacije. Uz pomoć poetike groteske i karikaturnoga pretjerivanja autor ukazuje na mehanizme moći i licemjerje društvenih i političkih uloga, dok se uporabom tradicionalnih, ali nekonvencionalno korištenih materijala približava „pučkom“ izrazu.

Rad je relevantan i inovativan pomak u suvremenim umjetničkim praksama odnosa prema povijesti, koja zrcali suvremenu političku i društvenu stvarnost. Razrađenom scenografijom i artikuliranim umjetničkim izrazom Kožul ukazuje na način na koji se povijesni događaji koriste u izgradnji nacionalnih i romantizirajućih narativa – kao prostor manipulacije i mitologizacije, ali i kao alat demonstracije moći i dominantne ideologije. U tom se kontekstu rad može čitati kroz logiku karnevalizacije, kao prostor izvruća i razotkrivanja u kojem se brišu granice između visokog i niskog, ozbiljnog i smiješnog, uzvišenog i banalnog, čime se povijesni narativ Seljačke bune oslobađa značenja i pretvara u polje kritičke, groteskne i satirične reinterpetacije.

Likovi baruna Tahyja i vojvotkinje, kao simbola feudalne vlasti, te vodoriga koje „rigaju“ omče, što je izravna referenca na pogubljenje seljaka nakon sloma bune, namjerno su deformirani i groteskni, čime se njihov autoritet i uzvišenost sustavno potkopava. Figure nisu izrađene od uzvišenih, plemenitih materijala poput bronce ili kamena, nego od neprikladnih i pristupačnih materijala – barun je oblikovan kao rogata figura s dodacima zvončića i otpacima materijala, a vojvotkinja je re-

GRAND PRIX OF THE 15th TRIENNIAL OF CROATIAN SCULPTURE Kristian Kožul

In his artwork entitled *Flags* (1573), **Kristian Kožul** deconstructs the historical narrative and the myth related to the Croatian-Slovene Peasant Rebellion by applying various artistic procedures, aiming at questioning instruments of the governing structures and the way they are presented. Through the poetics of grotesque and caricatural exaggeration, the author indicates to the mechanisms of power and the hypocrisy of social and political roles, whilst by using traditional, yet unconventionally used material, he came nearer to *folk* expression.

The piece presents a relevant and innovative move in contemporary artistic practices regarding dealing with historical topics, mirroring the present-day political and social reality. Using a well-worked-out scenography and an articulated artistic expression, Kožul indicates to the manner in which historical events have been used for developing national and romanticising narratives – not only as a medium for manipulation and mythologization, but also as a tool for demonstrating power and the dominant ideology. Within this context, the piece may be seen through the logic of carnivalization, as a space of distortion and disclosure, where the boundaries between high and low, serious and ridiculous, elevated and banal are erased. Thereby, the historical narrative of peasant rebellion is freed from meaning and translated into a field of critical, grotesque and satirical reinterpetation.

The figures of Baron Tahy and the duchess, symbolising feudal rule, and the gargoyles *breathing* nooses as a direct reference to the execution of the peasants after the rebellion had been suppressed, are intentionally deformed and grotesque, whereby their

Apsurdnost prikaza dodatno se pojačava razigranom, gotovo dekorativnom scenografijom u kojoj su figure postavljene na improvizirane pijedestale, na umjetnoj zelenoj travi sa zgaženim keramičkim cvijećem, stvarajući kontrast koji se može čitati kao kritika romantiziranja povijesnih trauma i njihove (zlo)upotrebe u suvremenim ideologijama.

U tom smislu i sam naslov *Barjaci* – promatran u svezi s književnim i likovnim referencama koje se koriste motivom zastava – može se shvatiti kao simbol oko kojeg se okuplja kolektiv, ali i kao nagovještaj krize i nasilja. Iako se izravno poziva na 1573. godinu, rad jasno govori o današnjem društvu upozoravajući na urušavanje i izvrtanje demokratskih vrijednosti te na sveprisutnu prijetnju povratka modernog feudalizma.

Rad *Barjaci* (1573.) istaknuo se inovativnošću, visokom izvedbenom kvalitetom i relevantnošću u korištenju povijesnog narativa kao sredstva kritičkog promišljanja suvremene stvarnosti. Kožul ostvaruje jasan i uravnotežen odnos između koncepta, umjetničkih postupaka i narativa, oblikovan u jedinstven umjetnički izraz. Kombinacijom različitih umjetničkih strategija rad proizvodi slojevita značenja koja destabiliziraju postojeći poredak otvaranjem pitanja odnosa mita, povijesti i kolektivnog identiteta te uloge aktera koji sudjeluju u njihovu oblikovanju. Zbog navedenoga, Ocjenivački sud *XV. trijenala hrvatskoga kiparstva* dodjeljuje Kristianu Kožulu Veliku nagradu *XV. trijenala*.

TRI JEDNAKOVRIJEDNE NAGRADE XV. TRIJENALA HRVATSKOGA KIPARSTVA Petar Popijač, Marina Rajšić, Igor Ruf

Petar Popijač u radu *Polje* polazi od tradicionalnoga kiparskog materijala – gline – kojem pristupa i koji re-interpretira kroz suvremenu ekološku svijest o posljedicama ljudskoga djelovanja. Procesu realizacije reljefa od pečene gline, koji prikazuje isječak travnate površine, prethodilo je uranjanje suhe trave u tekuću glinu. Tijekom sušenja i pečenja trava je izgorjela, no njezin vanjski oblik ostao je sačuvan prateći formu u najsitnijim detaljima. Iako su ti oblici mehaničkim postupkom fiksirani u vremenu i prostoru, okamenjeni trag trave i dalje sadrži ritam, pokret i dojam živosti. Umjetnik gradi napetost kroz kontrast žive i „mrtve“ prirode, statičnosti i dinamičnosti te prirodnog rasta i umjetničke intervencije.

U reljefu se naziru i tragovi ljudske prisutnosti – otisci stopala ili prolazak stroja – čime se otvara pitanje odnosa prirode i čovjeka sugerirajući njihov nejednak odnos snaga, gdje svaka ljudska intervencija ostavlja trag, bio on vidljiv ili nevidljiv, nepovratan ili prolazan. Krhkost gline postaje ključni nositelj značenja – materijal čije su karakteristike u ovom radu istodobno i trajne i lomljive simbolički upućuje na osjetljivost ekosustava, eroziju i

authority and eminence are systematically undercut. The figures have not been made of fine, noble materials such as bronze or stone, but rather of unsuitable and approachable ones – the baron as a figure with horns, with bells and waste parts added, whilst the duchess has been reduced to a decapitated head with a collar consisting of broken bottles and a red wig from which horns protrude, with red ceramic tears spread all over her body.

The absurdity of the presentation is additionally intensified by playful, almost decorative scenography: the figures are placed on improvised pedestals – on artificial green grass with crushed ceramic flowers. This creates a contrast that may be understood as a critique of romanticising historical traumas and their (mis) use in contemporary ideologies.

In this sense, the very title – *Flags*, observed in relation to literary and visual references using this motive, may be understood as a symbol of collective gathering, as well as an omen of crisis and violence. Despite its direct reference to the year 1573, the piece clearly speaks of the present-day society, warning of the collapse and distortion of democratic values, and the omnipresent threat concerning the reestablishment of modern feudalism.

The artwork entitled *Flags (1573)* excels among the others by innovativeness, high level of performative quality, and relevance in using the historical narrative as a means of critical reflection on the present-day reality. Kožul develops a clear and balanced relationship among the concept, artistic procedures and the narrative, shaped as part of a unique artistic expression. By combining diverse artistic strategies, the piece produces multilevel interpretations that lead to the destabilisation of the existing order, and open questions regarding the relationships among myth, history and collective identity, as well as the role of the participants in their formation. Due to all the above mentioned, the Prize Awarding Committee has decorated Kristian Kožul with the Grand Prix of the 15th Croatian Sculpture Triennial.

THREE EQUAL AWARDS OF THE 15th TRIENNIAL OF CROATIAN SCULPTURE Petar Popijač, Marina Rajšić, Igor Ruf

In his artwork entitled *Field*, **Petar Popijač** takes as a starting point a traditional sculptural material – clay, which he deals with and reinterprets through contemporary eco conscience regarding the effects of human intervention. The process of creating the relief in baked clay, presenting a segment of an area covered in grass, was preceded by immersing dry grass in liquid clay. The grass got burnt during the drying and baking processes, however its outer shape has been preserved, following the form into the smallest detail. Though these shapes had been fixed in time and space mechanical procedure, the petrified trace of grass continues to contain

neizbježne prirodne cikluse.

Jedna od triju jednakovrijednih nagrada *XV. trijenala hrvatskoga kiparstva* dodjeljuje se Petru Popijaču za rad *Polje*, koji kroz inovativan i sadržajan postupak obrade tradicionalnoga kiparskog materijala tematizira ekološka pitanja artikulirajući odnos prirode i ljudske intervencije.

Marina Rajšić u radu *Pauzirane čestice Lipe* nastavlja višegodišnje umjetničko istraživanje povezano s naseljem Lipa, jednim od rijetkih mjesta u Europi potpuno uništenih tijekom Drugoga svjetskog rata. Nadovezujući se na prethodni rad *Čestice Lipe*, umjetnica u vanjskom prostoru izložbe predstavlja skulpturalnu formu izrađenu od smjese izomalta i praha lišća lipe, uz prateću videodokumentaciju prethodnog rada.

Odabirom materijala i lokacije izlaganja umjetnica svjesno odustaje od ideje skulpture kao trajnog objekta te oblikuje vremenski ograničeno djelo čija se forma mijenja, razgrađuje i nestaje. Izomalt, materijal sličan šećeru, u čvrstom je stanju stabilan i postojan, no izložen vodi i višim temperaturama postupno se razgrađuje. Ta nestabilna priroda materijala – trajnost nasuprot neizbježnom nestajanju – ključna je za razumijevanje rada. Prah lišća lipe, kao simbol obnove zajednice koja je nakon ratnog razaranja izgradila nove temelje tolerancije i mira, privremeno je „pauziran“ unutar forme, spreman za skorašnje oslobađanje. Izlaganjem rada u vanjskom prostoru muzeja aktiviraju se biološki i fizički procesi neovisni o volji umjetnice ili promatrača koji postaje aktivni svjedok transformacije forme i protoka vremena. Atmosferilije postupno mijenjaju izgled skulpture: ona se topi, raspada i nestaje, dok se prah lišća oslobađa. Upravo zahvaljujući toj stalnoj interakciji s okruženjem materijal postaje nositelj značenja, a proces razgradnje i oslobađanja materijala postaje metafora društvene memorije, kolektivnih iskustava i mogućnosti revitalizacije zajednice obilježene ratnim traumama.

Zbog dosljednog i promišljenog povezivanja materijalnosti, procesa te društvenog i političkog konteksta u jedinstvenu umjetničku cjelinu koja propituje granice trajnosti i prolaznosti djela te mogućnosti kolektivne regeneracije, kao i zbog procesualnoga karaktera rada, Marini Rajšić dodjeljuje se jedna od triju jednakovrijednih nagrada *XV. trijenala hrvatskoga kiparstva*.

Istraživački proces u radu *Bernardi u mirovini* autora **Igora Rufa** započinje slučajnim pronalaskom fotelje hrvatskoga dizajnera Bernarda Bernardija na glomaznom otpadu, koja postaje gradivni element ove prostorne instalacije. Iako je rekonstrukcijom stolici vraćen njezin nekadašnji izgled, njezina prvobitna funkcija ostaje neostvarena – stolica se zadržava u prostoru umjetnikova atelijera kao povijesno i estetski visokovaloriziran predmet u stanju neupotrebljivosti i nenamjerne odbačenosti.

Shvaćanje da stvari žive i dobivaju značenje tek uporabom potiče inkorporiranje Bernardijeve stolice kao središnjeg dijela instalacije, koju umjetnik nadograđuje elektromotorom, štapom za pecanje i gumenom

rhythm, movement and an impression of vivacity. The tension becomes intensified through contrast between live nature and still life, static and dynamic qualities, as well as natural growth and artistic intervention.

Traces of human presence may be spotted in the relief too – foot traces or a machine passing over the meadow, whereby the issue of the relationship between man and nature emerges, suggesting their disbalance of forces. Here, any human intervention leaves a trace, be it visible or not, irreversible or transient. The frailty of clay becomes the key holder of meaning – the material further suggests erosion and natural cycles of change. The frailty of clay becomes the key holder of meaning – the material that is here permanent and frail at the same time symbolically indicates the sensitivity of the eco system, erosion and unavoidable natural cycles.

Petar Popijač is awarded one of three ex aequo prizes of the 15th Croatian Sculpture Triennial for his artwork *Field*, which thematises ecological issues through innovative and content-related treatment of a traditional sculptural material, articulating thereby the relationship between nature and human intervention.

In her artwork entitled *Paused particles of Lipa*, **Marina Rajšić** continues her yearlong artistic research related to the settlement of Lipa, one of only a few places in Europe completely destroyed during the Second World War. Following up on her previous piece entitled *Particles of Lipa*, the artist presents in the exhibition exterior a sculptural form consisting of a mixture of isomalt and powdered linden leaves, with accompanying video-documentation related to the previous piece.

By selecting the material and the exhibition venue, the artist deliberately abandons the idea of a sculpture as a permanent object, and shapes a temporally limited piece whose form changes, becomes decomposed, and disappears. Isomalt, material similar to sugar, is solid and constant at room temperature; however, when exposed to water and higher temperatures, it gradually becomes decomposed. Its unstable nature – permanence opposite to unavoidable transience – is crucial for the understanding of the piece. Powdered linden leaves, as a symbol of the renewal of the community that managed to rebuild itself on new foundations of tolerance and peace following war destruction, are temporarily being *paused* inside the form, ready to be freed soon. Biological and physical processes independent of the will of either the artist or the observer, who becomes an active witness of the transformation of the form and the flow of time, are activated by the piece being exhibited in the museum exterior. The weathering factors change the sculpture gradually: it melts, decays and disappears, whereas powdered leaves are freed. It is through this constant interaction with the environment that the matter becomes the holder of meaning, whilst the process of disintegration and freeing of the material turns into a metaphor of collective memory, joint experiences and possibilities of the revitalization of

lopticom. Tako opremljena stolica periodično „zabacuje“ mamac, no bez mogućnosti stvarnog ulova. Bacanje se aktivira senzorom koji registrira prolazak posjetitelja, čime njegova prisutnost postaje nuždan preduvjet za pokretanje rada. Ritmičko udaranje loptice o površinu apstraktno oblikovane forme proizvodi ponavljajući zvuk koji ispunjava prostor i tvori jednostavnu, gotovo meditativnu zvučnu sekvencu. Spajanjem elemenata koji na prvi pogled nemaju zajedničkih dodirnih točaka stvara se začudan i suptilno duhovit ambijent, proizašao iz autorovih osobnih iskustava, interesa i vizualnih asocijacija.

Vrijednost rada kojem se dodjeljuje jedna od tri jednakovrijedne nagrade *XV. trijenala hrvatskoga kiparstva* proizlazi iz spoja raznovrsnih objekata i aktivnosti, čime se dobiva uvid u autorov umjetnički proces i način razmišljanja o odnosima funkcije, upotrebe i značenja. Zahvaljujući autorovoj autoironičnoj identifikaciji te iznenadnoj aktivaciji instalacije, rad se iz pojedinačnog objekta transformira u prostornu scenu, čime se pomiče naglasak s pukog promatranja na razvoj iskustvenog doživljaja, dok se značenje rada ne nudi unaprijed, nego se otkriva u samom susretu posjetitelja s radom.

POSEBNO PRIZNANJE OCJENJIVAČKOG SUDA XV. TRIJENALA HRVATSKOGA KIPARSTVA Viktor Popović

Prostorna instalacija autora **Viktora Popovića** pod nazivom *Bez naziva (Arhiv Gliptoteke)* umjetnikova je refleksija o specifičnim okolnostima održavanja ovogodišnjega *Trijenala* obilježenog privremenim izmještanjem iz matične ustanove zbog obnove Gliptoteke HAZU nakon potresa. Rad tematizira institucionalnu i prostornu izmještenost muzeja preko fotografija koje dokumentiraju trenutačno stanje muzejske infrastrukture i organizaciju privremene čuvaonice, u kojoj je pohranjen fundus od oko 12.000 umjetnina.

Fotografije, koje je snimio sam autor, predstavljene su na samostojećim dvostranim svjetlosnim kutijama, postavljenima na muzejskim postamentima iz stalnog postava Gliptoteke HAZU i učvršćenima zateznim trakama. Zahvaljujući selektivnom odabiru motiva i načinu prezentacije, fotografije nadilaze svoju dokumentarnu vrijednost i postaju sredstvo promišljanja institucionalne infrastrukture, arhivskih praksi i vidljivosti fundusa u stanju fragilnosti i izmještenosti muzeja. Transformacija funkcije vidljiva je i u tretmanu muzejskih postamena-ta koji u ovom radu postaju nositelji značenja i svjedoci muzejske prošlosti upućujući na odsutnost skulptura i gubitak prvotne funkcije. Rad se razvija u dijalogu s prostorom Muzeja suvremene umjetnosti, koji djeluje kao aktivni sudionik u promišljanju institucionalne odsutnosti i odnosa dviju muzejskih institucija. Posebno priznanje dodjeljuje se Viktoru Popoviću za inovativnu tematizaciju odsutnosti i izmještenosti muzeja i same manifestacije, za ostvarenje specifičnoga prostornog narativa te

a community that had suffered traumas caused by the war.

Marina Rajšić is awarded one of three ex aequo prizes of the 15th Croatian Sculpture Triennial for consistent and well-thought-out integration of materiality, processes, and social and political context into a unique artistic whole questioning boundaries of the permanence and transience of the artwork, and possibilities of collective regeneration, as well as for the artwork's processual character.

Research process related to the artwork entitled *Bernardi retired* by **Igor Ruf** began after he had accidentally, among bulky waste, come across an armchair created by the Croatian designer Bernardo Bernardi. The armchair subsequently became a building element of this spatial installation. Though it had been reconstructed so that it looks the same as before, the original function of the armchair has not been revived – it is retained in the artist's studio as an object of high historical and aesthetical value, yet non-functional and unintentionally rejected.

The idea of things being alive and assuming meaning only through usage animates the incorporation of Bernardi's armchair in the installation as the central piece, with an electromotor, a fishing rod and a rubber ball added to it. The armchair, equipped with a fishing rod and a rubber ball, periodically *swings* the bait, yet the fishing attempts remain unsuccessful. The thumping activates the sensor recording every observer passing, whereby their presence becomes necessary for setting the piece in motion. Rhythmical thumping of the ball against the surface of an abstract form produces a repetitive sound that fills the space and develops a simple, almost meditative sound sequence. By combining elements that at first glance bear no common features, a remarkable and subtly witty ambience stemming from the author's personal experiences, interests and visual associations, is created.

The value of this artwork, which is awarded one of three ex aequo prizes of the 15th Croatian Sculpture Triennial, lies in joining diverse objects and activities, offering thereby an insight into the author's artistic process and mindset regarding the interrelations of function, use and meaning. Through the author's self-mocking identification and sudden activation of the installation, the piece transforms from an individual object into a spatial scene, shifting thereby the accent from mere observation to the development of experience, whereas the meaning of the artwork is not offered in advance, but rather revealed in the very act of meeting between the observer and the artwork.

NAGRADA LJEVAONICE UMJETNINA UJEVIĆ Marija Josipović

U radu *Posude obnove* **Marija Josipović** polazi od ideje obnove i promjene razvijajući je u dijalogu tradicionalnoga kiparskog materijala i organske forme te odnosu rada prema prostoru i promatraču. Polazište rada jest oblikovanje skulpture koja pokreće ideju obnove te aktivno uključivanje publike, koje se ostvaruje preuzimanjem i sadnjom figura od nepečene gline sa sjemenkama biljke tulsi, izloženima u posudama od terakote, čime se rad nastavlja izvan institucionalnog prostora. Sudjelovanjem publike uspostavlja se proces u kojem se skulptura transformira na više razina – materijalno, razgradnjom gline u prirodno gnojivo, formalno, nestankom skulpturalne forme, te biološki, rastom biljke – dok se istodobno angažman promatrača kao aktivnog sudionika i nositelja promjene simbolički povezuje s regenerativnim svojstvima biljke tulsi. Time se rad pozicionira unutar shvaćanja skulpture kao procesualne i relacijske prakse, u kojoj umjetničko djelo nije definirano trajnom formom, nego nizom odnosa, djelovanja i transformacija koje se odvijaju izvan zadanog vremena i prostora. Čin sadnje uspostavlja ekološku dimenziju rada kao metaforu zajedničke brige za budućnost, okoliš i međuljudsku solidarnost, a istovremeno redefinira tradicionalno shvaćanje skulpture kao trajnog artefakta. Zbog suvremene interpretacije tradicionalnoga kiparskog materijala i organske forme, u kojoj su glina i biljka ključni nositelji izraza i značenja, (zbog) potvrde kontinuiteta tradicije i vrijednosti tehničkoga umijeća, (zbog) organskog razvoja forme kroz proces razgradnje materijala i biološkog rasta, čime skulptura poprima procesualni i ekološki karakter, te zbog uključivanja posjetitelja i ambijenta kao aktivnoga, strukturalnoga dijela rada, Mariji Josipović dodjeljuje se Nagrada Ljevaonice umjetnina Ujević na *XV. trijenalu hrvatskoga kiparstva*.

NAGRADA HRVATSKE SEKCIJE MEĐUNARODNOG UDRUŽENJA LIKOVNIH KRITIČARA AICA-E Miran Blažek

Ocjenjivački sud HS AICA-e (Radmila Iva Janković, Neva Lukić, Zvonko Maković) nagradu *XV. trijenala hrvatskoga kiparstva 2025. godine* jednoglasno dodjeljuje radu *Alignment (2023.)* **Mirana Blažeka**, djelu koje balansira na granicama medija – akcije, skulpture i prostorne instalacije – pri čemu autor koristi tek bazične tehnike i materijale, poput ugljena i drva.

Rad Mirana Blažeka istaknuo se upravo transformativnošću medija, tehnike i materijala. Pomoću naborjelih, djelomično pougljenjenih debala autor iscrtava linije na zidu muzeja, preobražavajući tako drvo u drev-

SPECIAL RECOGNITION OF THE AWARD JURY OF THE 15th TRIENNIAL OF CROATIAN SCULPTURE Viktor Popović

The spatial installation authored by **Viktor Popović** and entitled *Untitled (Archive Glyptotheque)* presents the artist's reflection on the specific circumstances in which this Triennial is held, marked by the museum being temporarily relocated from its principal exhibition space due to the restoration of the Glyptotheque building after the earthquake. The piece thematises the institutional and spatial relocation of the museum through photographs documenting the current state of the museum infrastructure and the organization of the temporary storeroom, which now houses the holdings numbering approximately 12,000 artworks.

The photographs, which have been taken by the author himself, are presented on freestanding double-sided light boxes set on museum mounts belonging to the permanent holdings of the Glyptotheque of the Croatian Academy of Sciences and Arts, and fastened by cargo straps. By choosing selected motives and the presentation mode, these photographs exceed their documentary value and turn into a means of reflecting on the institutional infrastructure, the archival practices and visibility of the holdings in the state of the fragility and relocation of the museum. The transformation of the function becomes furthermore visible in the treatment of museum mounts that represent holders of meaning and witnesses to the museum past, reminding us of the absence of sculptures and the loss of the principal function. The piece develops in the dialogue with its surrounding in the Museum of Contemporary Arts, which is an active participant in reflection on institutional absence and correlation between the two museum institutions. Special acknowledgement is awarded to Viktor Popović for his innovative thematization of the absence and relocation of the museum and the manifestation itself, the creation of a specific spatial narrative, and critical reflection on the museum as an institution, as well as the visibility and the invisibility of the museum holdings.

PRIZE OF THE UJEVIĆ ART FOUNDRY Marija Josipović

In her artwork entitled *Vessels of renewal*, **Marija Josipović** starts from the idea of renewal and change, and develops it through a dialogue between traditional sculptural material and organic form, as well as the relation of the piece towards space and the observer. The starting point of the artwork is the creation of a sculpture instigating the idea of renewal and active involvement of the audience, materialized through their taking over figures od unbaked clay with Tulsi seeds, exhibited in terracotta pots, and planting them; thus, the piece continues outside the institutional space. Through the

nu crtačku tehniku ugljena *in situ*. U Blažekovu slučaju akcija je intiman čin, nevidljiv publici. Nakon paljenja u prostor se, uza zid, polaže pet debala, od kojih je svako na zidu ostavilo svoju putanju. Otuda i naziv rada *Alignment* (u hrvatskom prijevodu „poravnanje” ili „usklađenost”): pougljenjeni segmenti debala veličinom odgovaraju tragovima ugljena na zidu.

Uz taj organski prizor pougljenjenih debala i nepravilnih crnih linija umjetnik ugljenom na zid ispisuje i tehnički dijagram kojim u djelo uvodi matematički sklad. Zapis „A=B=C=D=E=F=G=H=I=J” označava da linija na zidu odgovara pougljenjenom segmentu debala, koji potom odgovara sljedećoj liniji – sve do posljednjeg debala – dok zapis „1 ≠ 2 ≠ 3 ≠ 4 ≠ 5” naglašava da su sva debala međusobno različita. Iza scene rada krije se još jedan neizostavan, šamanski element: vatra. Drvo prolazi kroz vatru kako bi postalo crtačka tehnika, a potom i mjera – linija koja nikad nije identična, baš kao što nijedno deblo nije identično drugome.

Primordijalnim i istodobno tehničkim pristupom, umjetnik provodi neku vrstu eksperimenta, oponašajući principe prema kojima djeluje sama priroda, kao da je upravo krenuo stvarati module neke veće, imaginarne strukture.

U djelu *Alignment* Miran Blažek kroz jednostavnost forme i postupka skulpturi pristupa interdisciplinarno, tražeći unutar postulata djela i njihove suprotnosti: jednako postaje različito, organsko prelazi u matematičko, intuitivno se susreće s analitičkim. Slojevitost rada i njegova interdisciplinarnost proizlaze iz tek jednog čina i jednog materijala – drva – te procesa njegova paljenja.

NAGRADA GORANSKE KIPARSKÉ RADIONICE LOKVE Vjekoslav Filipović

Vjekoslavu Filipoviću dodijeljena je Nagrada Goranske kiparske radionice Lokve za rad *Kombo KOR2* čime je umjetnik ostvario pravo sudjelovanja na 47. sazivu Goranske kiparske radionice Lokve, jednoj od najznačajnijih hrvatskih kiparskih manifestacija posvećenih radu u drvu, čime je prepoznata kvaliteta i potencijal autorova pristupa tradicijskom materijalu u suvremenom kiparskom kontekstu. Filipović je u radu *Kombo KOR2* realizirao skulpturu kao visoki reljef: tradicionalno drveno korito savijeno je po bočnoj strani i izloženo uspravno na zidu. Fino oblikovane stijenske, s jasno vidljivim tragovima dljeteta, stvaraju dinamičnu igru svjetla i sjene te naglašavaju odnos mase i prostora.

participation of the audience, a process is established, within which the sculpture becomes transformed on several levels – substantially, by clay changing into natural fertilizer; formally, by the sculptural form disappearing; and biologically, by the plant growing, whilst simultaneously engaging the observer as an active participant and holder of change is symbolically brought into connection with the regenerative attributes of Tulsi. The piece is hereby positioned within the framework of sculptures being understood as a processual and relational practice, in which artwork is not defined by a permanent form, but rather by a sequence of relationships, performances and transformations taking place outside the set time and space. The act of planting establishes the ecological dimension of the piece as a metaphor of community care for the future, environment and human solidarity, simultaneously redefining the traditional notion of sculpture as a lasting artefact. Marija Josipović is awarded the Ujević Art Foundry Prize at the 15th Croatian Sculpture Triennial for her contemporary interpretation of a traditional sculptural material and organic form, choosing clay and a plant as key holders of meaning and expression, (for) confirming the continuity of tradition and the value of technical mastery, (for) the organic development of the form through the process of the decomposition of the material and biological growth, whereby the sculpture assumes processual and ecological character, and for including the audience and the ambience as an active, structural part of the artwork.

PRIZE OF THE CROATIAN SECTION OF THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF THE ART CRITICS - AICA Miran Blažek

The HS AICA evaluation committee (Radmila Iva Janković, Neva Lukić, Zvonko Maković) unanimously confers the award of the 15th Triennial of Croatian Sculpture in 2025 to the work *Alignment* (2023) by **Miran Blažek**, a work situated at the intersection of action, sculpture, and spatial installation, with the author using only basic techniques and materials such as charcoal and wood.

Miran Blažek's work is distinguished by its transformative approach to medium, technique, and material. Through the use of charred, partially carbonised tree trunks, the artist draws lines directly onto the museum wall, thereby transforming wood into the ancient drawing medium of charcoal *in situ*. For Blažek, the action is an intimate act, invisible to the audience. After burning, five tree trunks are laid out along the wall, each inscribing its own trajectory onto the wall surface. Hence the title *Alignment*, which refers to the charred segments of the trunks matching in size the charcoal traces left on the wall.

Alongside the organic depiction of charred trunks and irregular black lines, the artist also inscribes a technical diagram in charcoal onto the wall, introducing

a sense of mathematical harmony into the work. The sequence “A=B=C=D=E=F=G=H=I=J” marks the alignment between each line on the wall and a charred segment of a trunk, continuing through to the final trunk. The notation “1 ≠ 2 ≠ 3 ≠ 4 ≠ 5”, by contrast, emphasises the distinctiveness of each trunk. Underlying the scene of the work is another essential, shamanic element: fire. Wood is subjected to fire in order to become a drawing medium and, subsequently, a unit of measure – a line that is never identical, just as no trunk is identical to another.

Employing a primordial, but also a technical approach, the artist conducts a kind of experiment that mirrors the principles of nature itself, as if he had only just begun to construct the modules of a larger, imaginary structure.

In *Alignment* Miran Blažek adopts an interdisciplinary approach to sculpture, grounded in the simplicity of form and process, through which he explores the internal postulates of the work and their opposites: sameness gives way to difference, the organic is translated into the mathematical, and intuition meets analysis. The work's layered nature and interdisciplinarity stem from a single act and a single material: wood, and the process of its burning.

PRIZE OF THE GORAN SCULPTURE WORKSHOP OF LOKVE Vjekoslav Filipović

Vjekoslav Filipović was awarded the Prize of the Goran Sculpture Workshop of Lokve for the work *Kombo KOR2*, which earned the artist the right to participate in the 47th convocation of the the Goran Sculpture Workshop of Lokve, one of the most important Croatian sculpture events dedicated to working in wood, which recognized the quality and potential of the author's approach to traditional material in a contemporary sculptural context. In the work *Kombo KOR2*, Filipović realized the sculpture as a high relief: a traditional wooden trough is bent on the side and displayed upright on the wall. The finely shaped wooden walls, with clearly visible chisel marks, create a dynamic play of light and shadow and emphasize the relationship between mass and space.

SOLO EXHIBITION OF THE GRAND PRIX WINNER OF THE 14th TRIENNIAL OF CROATIAN SCULPTURE

LOREN ŽIVKOVIĆ KULJIŠ: *WITHOUT WORDS*

Ciklus instalacija Lorena Živkovića Kuljiša *Nešto za nešto* polazi od univerzalnog arhetipskog načela razmjene, davanja i primanja koje oblikuje sve slojeve zajedničke stvarnosti. Naziv sugerira krajnje pojednostavnjen, opisno predstavljen tržišni proces, tek pokušaj da se imenuje odnos koji izmiče preciznom određenju. Proces „nešto za nešto“ nemjerljiv je, proizvoljan i nestalan, onkraj je strogoće metričkog sustava. Riječ je o subjektivnome vrijednosnom sustavu koji ovisi isključivo o konsenzusu obje strane, u kojem se vrijednosti „proizvoda“ trebaju preklopiti i poništiti. U drugom smislu sintagma „nešto za nešto“ označava klasični linearni, uzročno-posljedični odnos. Iz kiparske pozicije on se ogleda u predvidljivosti materijalā te poznavanju njihovih svojstava i proizašlog ponašanja, koje autorov analitički nerv nerijetko dekonstruira. U fokusu Lorena Živkovića Kuljiša nije pojedini materijal ni poznata reakcija (rezultat), prije je to sinergija raznorodnih materijala ili otpor koji pružaju kiparskom htijenju. Premda je intuitivna reakcija neizbježna u njegovu stvaralačkom procesu, čak je i ona odmjerena. Štoviše, kao da se tijekom stvaranja instalacija autor neprestano suspreže od predvidljiva kraja. Pet instalacija odabranih za ovu izložbu, pet rečenica (kako ih autor naziva), pet je zajedničkih stvarnosti u kojima se ogleda razigranost i znatiželja, osobine kojima u Lorenovu stvaralaštvu nema premca. U njegovim instalacijama moguće je pronaći zajednički nazivnik plastici, metalu, drvu, papiru i staklu. Moguće ga je pronaći u kiparstvu i crtežu. Kao i u likovnoj umjetnosti, književnosti i filozofiji, koje snaže zidove ateljea i motiviraju radni proces.

U novom ciklusu crteža *Bez riječi*, po kojem je nazvana izložba, autor se udaljava od prijašnjih referenci na književne i filozofske velikane otvarajući prostor za komunikaciju isključivo vizualnim jezikom. Taj pomak od

The starting point of the cycle of installations by Loren Živković Kuljiš, entitled *Something for something*, is the universal archetypal principle of exchange, giving and receiving that forms all layers of shared reality. The title suggests an ultra-simplified, descriptively presented trade process, a mere attempt to put a name to the relationship that avoids any concrete definition. The *something for something* process is unmeasurable, arbitrary and instable; it stands beyond the strictness of the metric system. It is a subjective value system depending exclusively on consensus, where the values of the 'product' are supposed to be overlapped and annulled. In another sense, the syntagm *something for something* stands for the classical linear, causal relationship. From the sculptor's angle, it is reflected in the predictability of the material, as well as in the familiarity with its qualities and the implied behaviour, which is often deconstructed thanks to the author's analytical touch. In Loren Živković Kuljiš's focus stands not a particular material or the known reaction (result), but rather synergy of diverse materials or their resistance to the sculptor's will. Although intuitive reaction is inevitably present in his creative process, even it is measured. Moreover, it seems as if in the course of creating the installations, the author kept supressing himself from the predictable end. Five installations selected for this exhibition – five sentences (as referred to by the author) – present five shared realities that reflect curiosity and high spirits – characteristics second to none in Loren's oeuvre. In his installations, one may find a common denominator for plastic, metal, wood, paper and glass. It may be traced not only in sculpture and drawing, but also in painting, literature and philosophy, which fortify the walls of the studio, and serve as motivation for the working process.



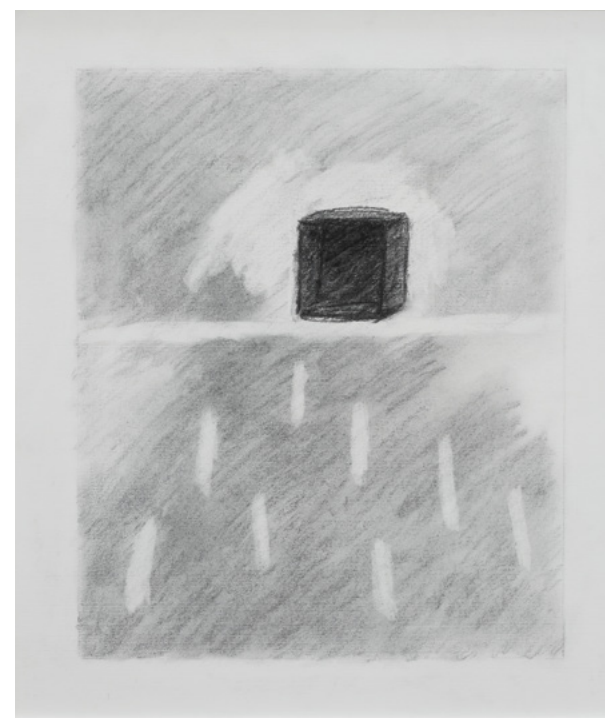
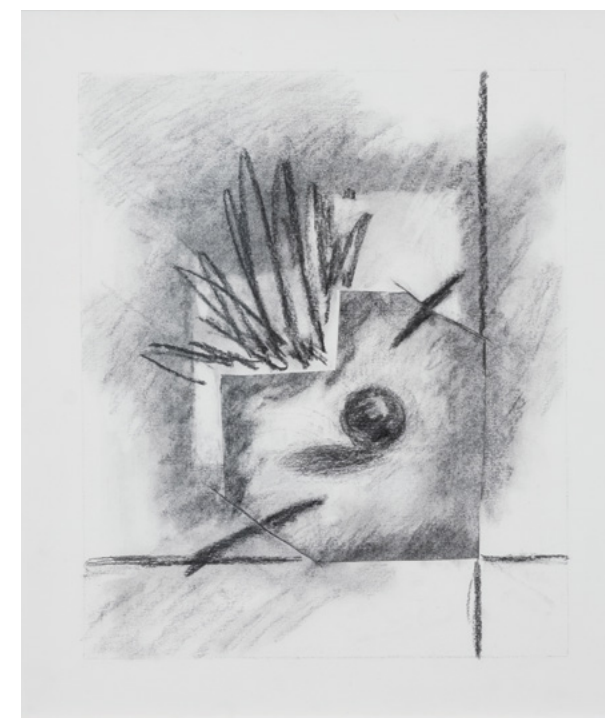
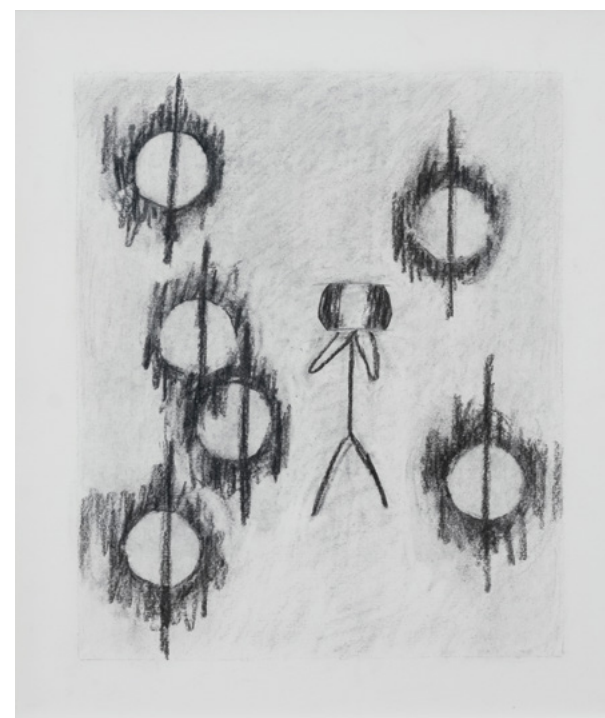
teksta prema slici nije tek formalna odluka, nego promišljanje o opterećujućem odnosu prema imenovanju i njegovu utjecaju na stvaralački proces. U tom kontekstu svaki crtež, kao i svaka instalacija, funkcionira poput samostalne rečenice, samodovoljne u svojoj namjeri, bez potrebe za verbalnim posredovanjem. Time se izbjegava tautologija i osigurava da ideja ostane u svojem izvornom, vizualnom obliku. Sadržaj crteža pak poziva na elementarnost, osnovnost, ponovno traženje zajedničkog nazivnika, ovoga puta čitavoj prirodi. Stoga izdvaja motiv kugle – savršenstvo koje postoji samo kao ideja, praiskonsko jaje. Naslov *Bez riječi* priziva tišinu prije jezika, trenutak stvaranja koji, poput zapisa u Knjizi postanka, prethodi imenovanju i oslobađa od njegovih ograničenja. Nadalje, u pojedinim se crtežima pojavljuju oblici domina ili pikule (u jednoj od instalacija), što asocijativno navodi na tragove djetinjstva i sjećanje na prve zapažene oblike.

Izložba Lorena Živkovića Kuljiša može se shvatiti kao svojevrsni odjek Kniferove poznate izjave: „Svoje sam posljednje slike već naslikao, a prve još ne.“ kojom se ovdje upućuje na trajnu potragu za onom „prvom slikom“ koja nikada nije dosegnuta ni dovršena, ali uvijek iznova rađa potrebu za stvaranjem. U središtu toga neprekidnog vraćanja elementarnomu, početnim oblicima, čistim materijalima i samoj ideji početka otkriva se autorova trajna fascinacija temeljnim principima likovnosti, smislom umjetničkog čina i mogućnosti vlastitog izraza.

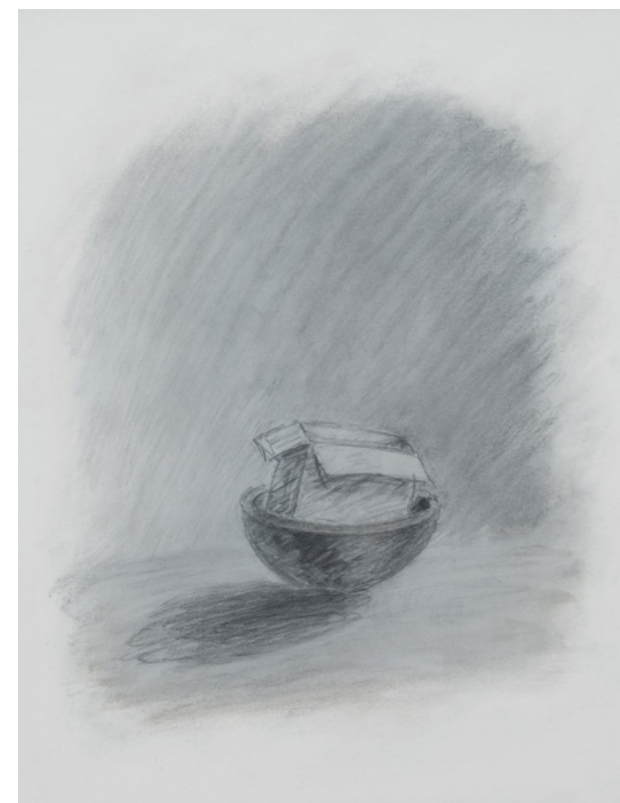
In his new cycle of drawings, entitled *Without Words*, which gave the name to the entire exhibition, the author deviates from earlier references to the champions of literature and philosophy, facilitating thereby communication using only visual language. This switch from text to picture is not a merely formal decision, but rather reflection on the encumbering relation toward nominating, and its impact on the creative process. In this context, every drawing, same as every installation, functions as an independent, self-sufficient sentence, with no need for verbal intervention. Thereby, the author avoids tautology, whilst preserving the idea in its original, visual form. The drawing, through its content, indicates elementariness, essentiality, and repeated search for a common denominator – this time for the nature as a whole. It thus singles out the motives of the sphere – the perfection existing only as the idea – the primal egg. The title *Without Words* calls for silence before speech, the moment of creation, which, like the text in the Genesis, precedes the nomination and frees from the limitations thereof. Furthermore, in certain drawings, the forms of dominos or marbles appear (in one installation); thereby, they awaken associations to the reminiscences of childhood and the memory of the forms encountered first.

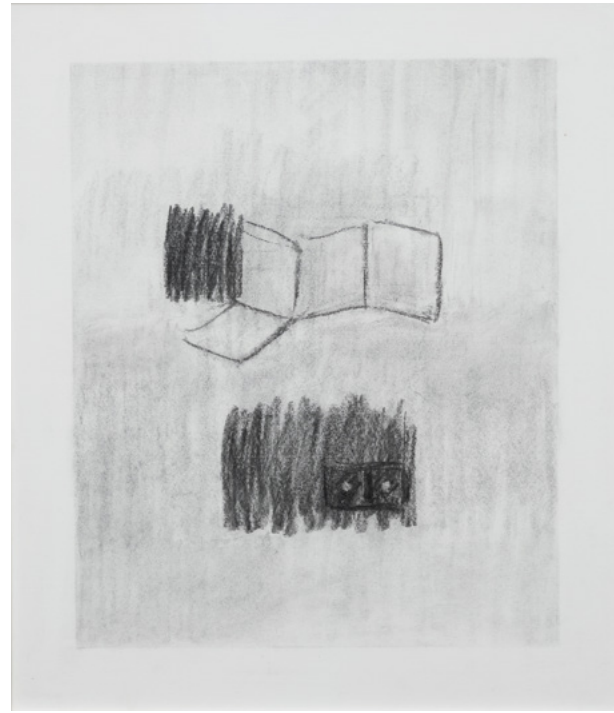
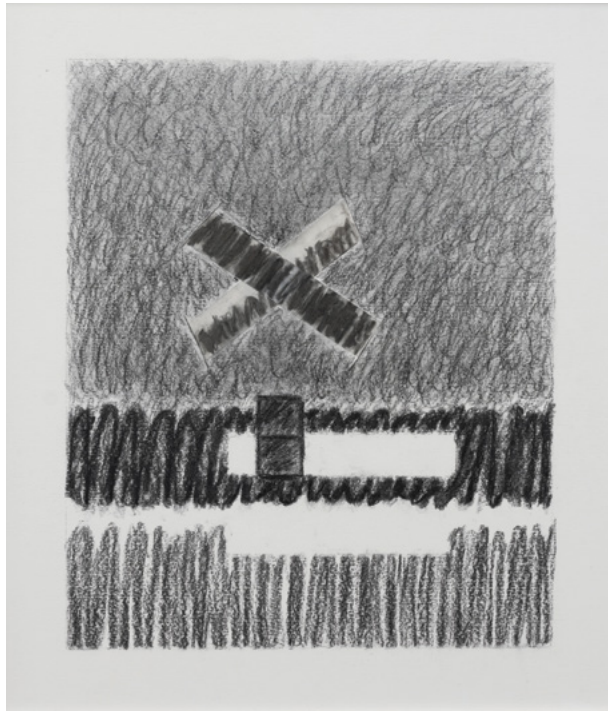
Loren Živković Kuljiš's exhibition may be understood as a kind of reverberation of Julije Knifer's well-known statement: *I have already made my last paintings, but not yet my first ones.* The reference here is permanent search for *the first painting* that the author has never reached or completed, but which repeatedly awakens in him the need for creation. In the centre of continual returning to the elementary, initial forms, pure materials and the idea of the beginning itself lies the author's lasting fascination with the basic principles of visibility, the purpose of the artistic act, and the possibility to express oneself.
